Member Benefits

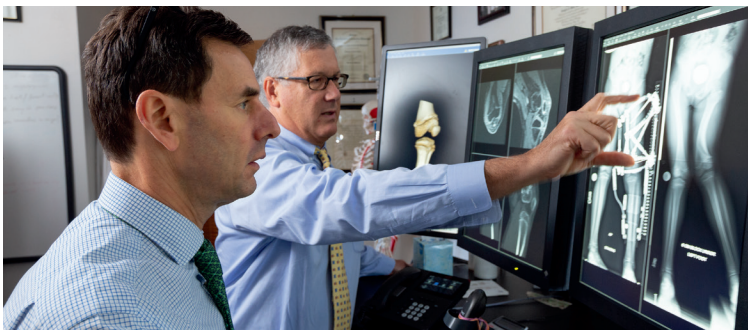
